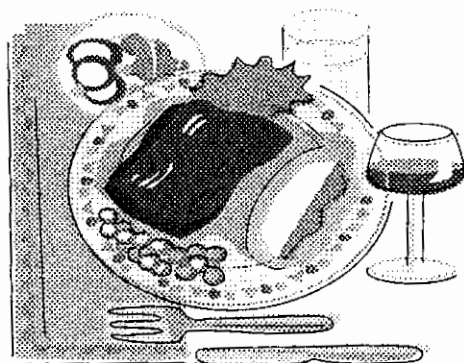

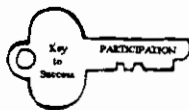

Your chair may be making you sick

Where are you right now? Lounging on an overstuffed couch with the newspaper and a cup of coffee? Sitting on a kitchen chair taking in the news online? Well, hope you're sitting down for this bit of news:

Your chair is slowly making you sick.

Chair disease, as we like to call it, is an increasingly common malady in the United States that is almost always caused by spending too much time parked on your rear end.

It's not really the chair's fault, though. The problem is that most of us sit wrong — slouched forward with our earlobes in front of our shoulders — and for hours without moving.

The result? Avoidable chair-related ailments, including flabby butts, an

increased risk of blood clots and back pain, the leading cause of disability in

Americans younger than 45. Sitting puts near-

ly twice the stress on the spine as standing; slouching while you sit increases the pressure even more. That's because hunching forward pushes the back into a convex or C shape. Try it. Now, pull your shoulders back and together, and put your hand on your lower back. That natural concave curve is what you want; slouching fatigues and overstretches the ligaments, causing back pain.

MOVEMENT IS KEY, because the disks in our vertebrae are important shock absorbers. When we're locked in one position, we're starving the disks of nutrients.

Sitting also tightens and shortens the psoas — the strong hip flexor — which can affect how the pelvis rotates and increase the load on the low back. The gluteal muscles, meanwhile, stretch out, but they're not being

used so they turn off and get weaker (flabbier!) from sitting.

A significant portion of low back pain can be remedied by avoiding the two most common sitting mistakes: leaning forward and having the chair too low.

But to really stand up to chair disease, try the following techniques:

1 CHANGE YOUR POSITION Stand up every 15 to 30 minutes and clasp your hands behind your back. Take a phone call standing instead of sitting or simply straighten up, contract your abs and lean back.

2 GET A TREADMILL DESK Some people operate their businesses at home while walking on a treadmill at 2.2 miles an hour. For more information, go to: officewalkers.ning.com.

3 SQUAT It's more comfortable than sitting because most of the weight of the abdomen is supported on the thighs.

4 USE A LUMBAR ROLL About 6 inches in diameter, lumbar rolls help maintain the natural curve of the back.

5 TRY THE ALEXANDER TECHNIQUE. Studies have shown that the postural educational system is an effective treatment for back pain when used in conjunction with exercise; alexander.technique.com

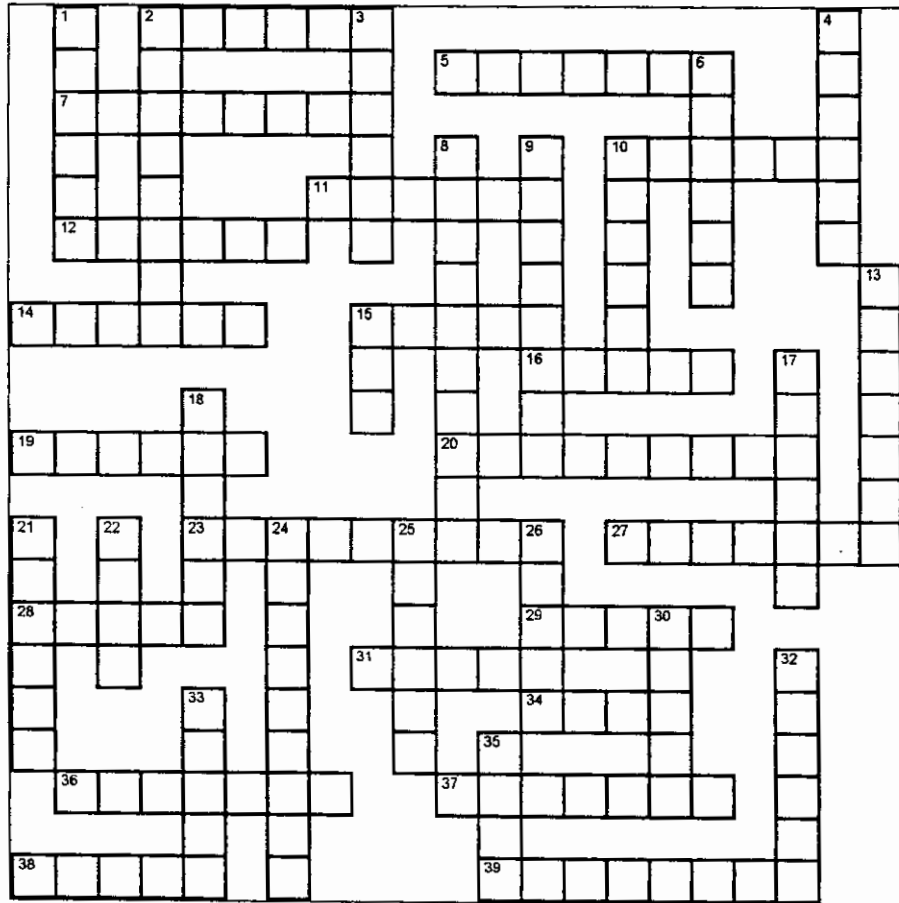

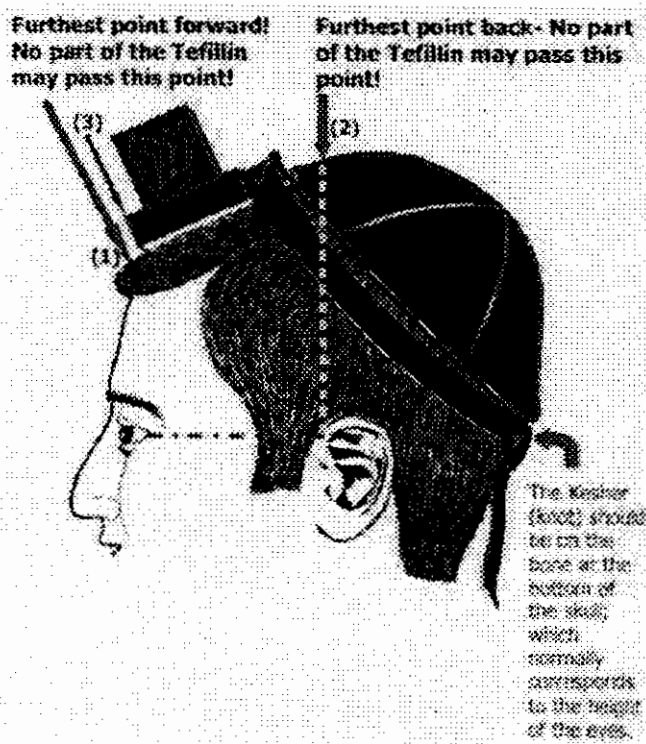
**UNBELIEVABLE WHAT THE CHINESE DISCOVERED ABOUT
TEFILLIN and ACUPUNCTURE**

Who of us doesn't know about Chinese acupuncture?

The Chinese discovered the medical treatment using needles to heal when they are inserted at certain points in the body. The Chinese have mapped out and named all the points of the body du 24 - du 70 - du 23, and so on. And the Chinese Journal of Medicine - to which everyone important in the field of Acupuncture subscribes - published an amazing article, absolutely astonishing. The main article in volume number 70 of the Journal deals solely with the Tefillin of the Jewish People. The article conclusively establishes that the contact and pressure points covered by the hand and head Tefillin are exactly those points at which the acupuncture needles are inserted in order "to increase spirituality and to purify thoughts." The non-Jewish author of the article puts it that the points covered by the Tefillin are those where the acupuncture needles are inserted. Reverse the statement to read: the Acupuncture needles are inserted in those points, which are exactly where a Jew puts on Tefillin. The article details all of the acupuncture points which are the same as the points-of-contact of the head Tefillin - front and back - as well as the points-of-contact of the hand Tefillin on the arm and hand. In the opinion of the expert who wrote the article, these are the only acupuncture points that will achieve this result [to increase spirituality and to purify thoughts] which, in addition to following the Torah's command to place the Tefillin on the arm (hand) and head as a sign that HASHEM brought us out of Egypt with a strong hand, is likely the reason that Jews put on Tefillin.

My Old Neighborhood

Always close to my heart is the old neighborhood. Whether it was in the Bronx or Brooklyn, Los Angeles or Minneapolis. It seems like it was the center of my life with pleasant memories, etc. There were so many phases of my life that I remember with ... Let me concentrate now on what I remember from the years that encompass World War II. From the beginning when I sat in a friends kitchen and listened to Pres Roosevelt tell us that we had been attacked in Pearl Harbor to watching the older guys vanish from our streets – I know that by today's psyche its hard to believe the patriotism that existed then. At 13 to 15 years old we were suddenly the big guys in the neighborhood. Stars were displayed in windows indicating family members that were serving and a huge banner was installed between two apartment houses with a large number of stars, each representing a neighborhood boy who was serving.

I recently had reason to return to the old neighborhood I grew up more than 60 years ago. Of course it seemed familiar, yet there were subtle differences, where I used to hear the buzz of Yiddish and Italian spoken in the streets I now saw unfamiliar faces and heard unfamiliar languages. The main avenue in this neighborhood, 18th Avenue, was still bustling but it was not the same, where there were kosher delis and large barrels of kosher pickles, the smell of east European cakes and pastry from the local bakery, the only familiarity that I noticed were still the pizza stores. Where the Walker theatre used to be, where I used to be consumed by movies with Betty Grable and John Wayne, I found it hard to believe that it is now a church. And the Colony theatre that used to play all the old classics like King Kong and Gunga Din was now a women's dress shop.

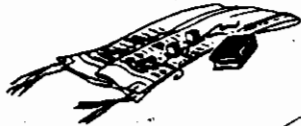


TALLIS & TEFILLIN

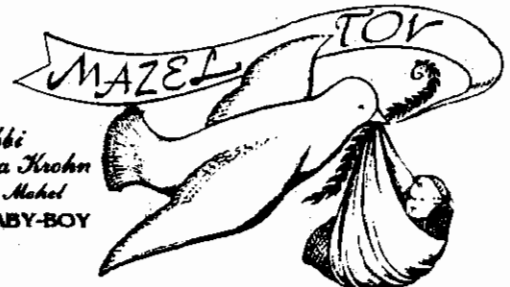

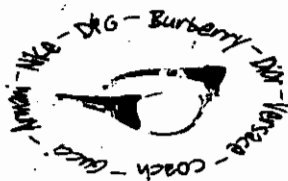

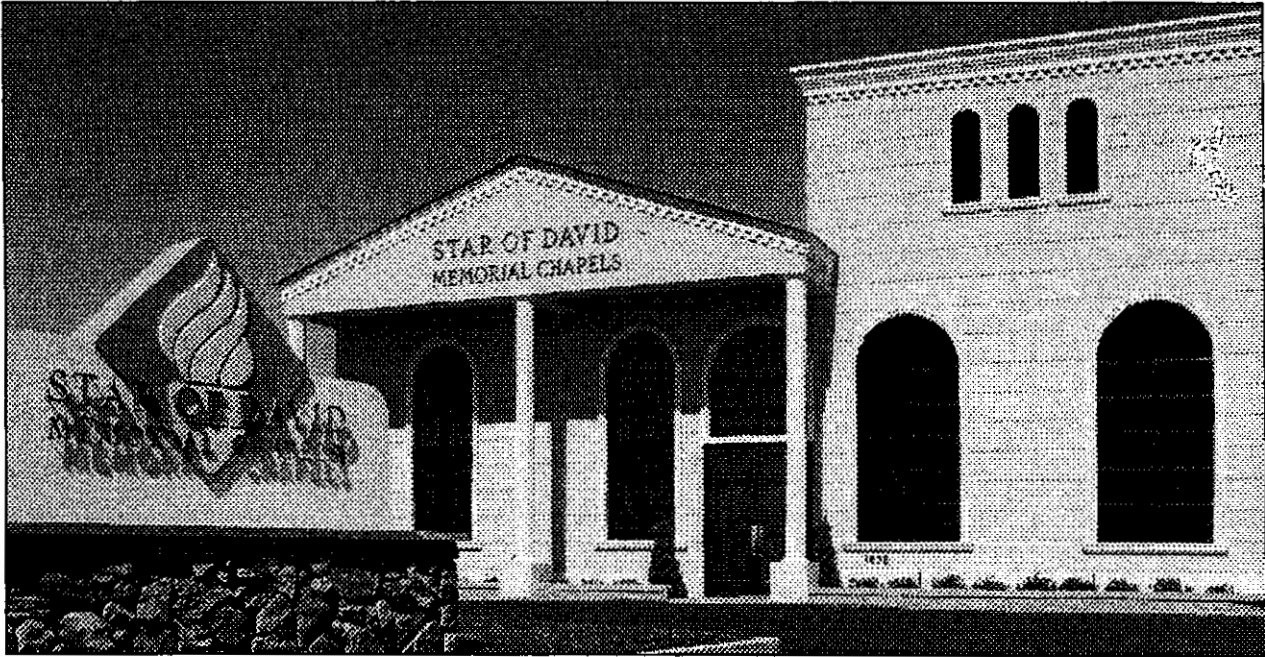
