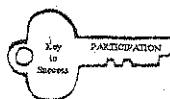

## 6 tips for buying safe toys

### Fuel Saving Tips

- 1. Drive at a moderate speed.** This is the biggest factor. Driving at 55 mph instead of 65 or 75 will save you money.
- 2. Drive smoothly.** Avoid hard acceleration and braking whenever possible.
- 3. Reduce unnecessary drag.** At highway speeds, more than 50 percent of engine power goes to overcoming aerodynamic drag. So don't carry things on top of your vehicle when you don't have to.
- 4. Don't use premium fuel if you don't have to.** If your car specifies regular fuel, don't buy premium under the mistaken belief that your engine will run better.
- 5. Minimize driving with a cold engine.** Engines run most efficiently when they're warm.
- 6. Keep tires properly inflated.** Check the pressure of your vehicle's tires at least once a month with a tire gauge.
- 7. Buy tires with lower rolling resistance.** A tire's rolling resistance can add or detract another 1 or 2 mpg.
- 8. Avoid idling for long periods.** As a rule, turn off your engine if you expect to sit for more than about 30 seconds.

**T**IS THE SEASON when millions of parents swarm toy stores, looking for the latest game or gizmo to give to the little ones they love. Entertaining and educational often top a parent's wish list, but safe should be No. 1. About 230,000 toy-related injuries are treated in hospital emergency rooms every year, according to the Consumer Products Safety Commission (CPSC). Here are some shopping tips:

**Pay attention to the age on the box.** There's a reason Barbie accessories, some Lego sets and *Hungry, Hungry Hippos* are not recommended for children under 3. They contain small parts that kids like to stick in their mouths, putting them at high risk for choking. Watch out for toys with button-size batteries and small magnets as well.

**Test out noisemakers.** Some musical instruments, toy sirens or squeaky playthings emit 90 decibels of sound — that's as loud as a lawn mower. Hold it close to your ear (as many kids do), and it's more like 120 dB, enough to hurt your hearing. Listen to the toy in the store; if it's too loud for you, find something quieter.

**Pass on "weapons."** Toy guns, slingshots or anything that flies or shoots can lead to serious

eye injuries, even blindness. Skip these types of toys for younger kids; for older ones, make sure arrows or darts, for example, have soft cork tips, rubber suction cups or other protective points.


**Measure strings and straps.** Cords longer than 7 inches can be a strangulation hazard.

**Be sure to get ride-on protection.** Scooters, skateboards and other riding toys are associated with more injuries than any other toy category. Proper-fitting helmets and pads are a must.

**Skip the antiques.** Though recent federal safety rules impose stricter regulations on lead content in toys, collectibles and older hand-me-downs, as well as some imported toys, can put kids at risk for lead exposure.

**Check for recalls.** The CPSC keeps an updated list of toy recalls; visit [cpsc.gov](http://cpsc.gov).

## Top 10 Tips for a Financially Safe Retirement

A robust and predictable income is a big concern for retirees. They need to know how to generate enough cash to maintain their lifestyle without exposing their assets to too much risk. Social Security is obviously a key source of steady cash for retirees and some also have a pension, an increasingly rare employer-sponsored retirement plan that pays out like clockwork. Here are 10 other ways for retired folks to obtain reliable income while keeping risk in check.

**1. An Immediate Fixed Annuity** - If you wanted the predictability of Social Security or a pension, you might go to an insurance company for an immediate fixed annuity - a contract for a guaranteed income stream for a specified time. As "immediate" suggests, the contract starts paying you virtually right away, usually the month after purchase and monthly thereafter.

**2. Systematic Withdrawals** - Since you typically can't get your money back from an annuity once it starts paying out, you might simply put the money in an investment account with a systematic withdrawal plan. Such a plan can be established in nonretirement and retirement accounts with a form instructing the investment company what sum to distribute monthly, quarterly or annually. You keep control of your money but you don't get the guarantee of an annuity.

**3. Bonds** - Bonds represent debt. So if you buy a bond, it means somebody owes you money and is regularly paying you interest. When assembled into a properly diversified portfolio, the safest bonds like those issued by the federal government, government agencies, and financially sound corporations can be a crucial source of dependable retirement income.

**4. Dividend-Paying Stocks** - Unlike bonds, stocks represent ownership and company owners may get regularly-scheduled dividends. Not all companies pay dividends, though, and dividends can be stopped if a company gets into financial trouble. Plus, stock prices sometimes plunge. That's why retirees who buy stocks for income should probably limit their exposure to this strategy and stick with large, very stable companies with a history of paying dividends.

**5. Life Insurance** - Life insurance really isn't meant to be a retirement plan, but it can be a welcome additional income source for retirees who find they're a bit short each month. The safest policy for the job is one like whole life or universal life that builds cash value on a schedule. People generally access the cash via loan or periodic withdrawal. The catch: loans and withdrawals reduce the policy death benefit by a like amount.

**6. Home Equity** - Relying too heavily on home equity to fund your retirement can be dangerous because home values could drop suddenly and reduce or wipe out your equity. Like life insurance, it might be better to think of home equity more as a backup plan. You can access it by selling your home or taking out some sort of home equity loan.

**7. Income Property** - Retired or not, it's nice to get that check each month when you rent out a home or sell one to someone and hold their mortgage (just like a bank). But it's not so fun if the renter or homeowner doesn't pay you. And remember, if you're a landlord, you're on the hook for property taxes and costs for upkeep.

**8. Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs)** - If you like real estate but aren't into being a landlord or mortgage holder, consider investing in REITs - companies that buy, sell and manage commercial properties like malls and apartments. REIT shares, which are purchased directly on securities exchanges or indirectly through mutual funds, pay high monthly or quarterly dividends and are liquid. But they can be volatile like regular stocks, so it's best not to overdo them.

**9. Savings Account and CD Interest** - When it comes to generating income, there's nothing safer or more reliable. While this strategy obviously isn't viable when CDs and savings accounts pay 2%, 1% or even less, it can be a fine option when interest rates are reasonable.

**10. Part-Time Employment** - Retirees often want to stay active and involved. Working part-time can be a good way to do that while earning extra income. And the only thing at risk is some time.

**The Bottom Line** -The nice thing about most of these 10 methods is they can be mixed and matched to suit your personality. However, knowing exactly what to do and getting just the right mix can be a bit complicated, so don't hesitate to consult a **qualified financial professional** for guidance.

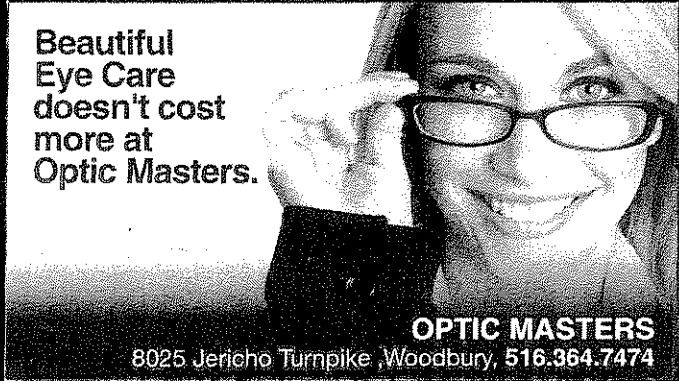

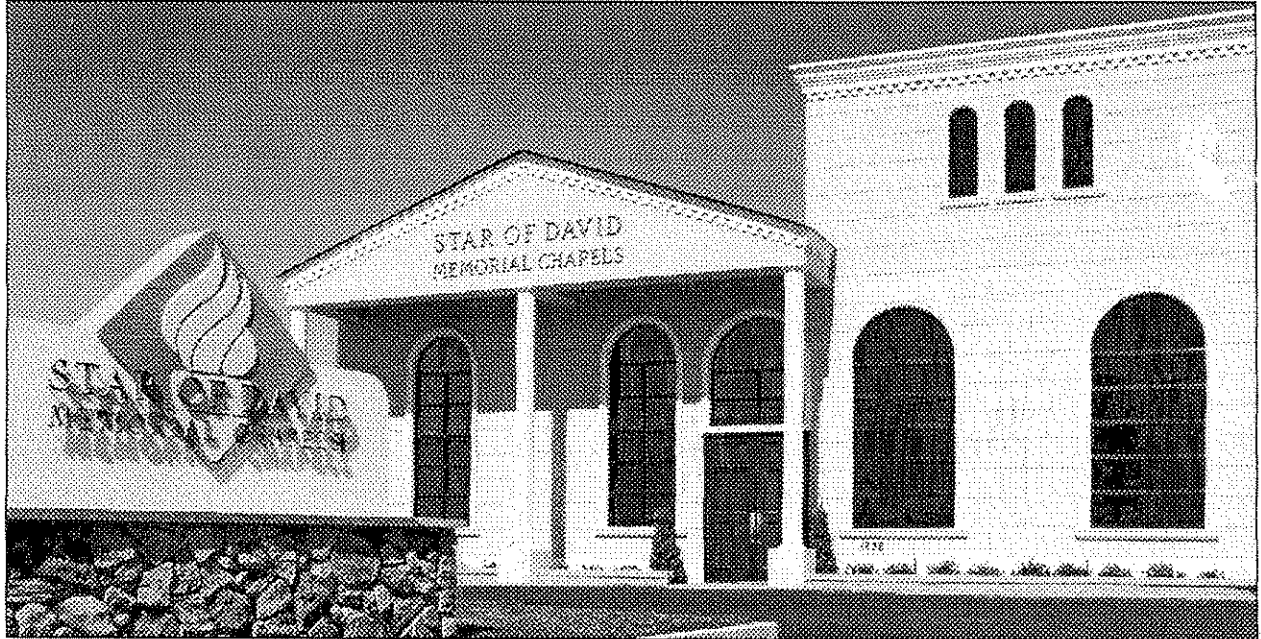

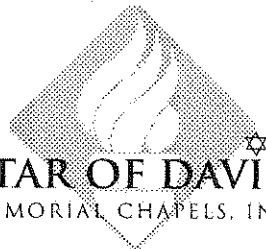

## Our Roving Reporter - AL Baker

A GREAT JEWISH BRONX TALE – author unknown

This is a wonderful story. Short but sweet. Be sure you read it all.

The South Bronx in 1950 was the home of a large and thriving community, predominantly Jewish. In the 1950s the Bronx offered synagogues, mikvas, kosher bakeries, and kosher butchers -- all the comforts one would expect from an observant Orthodox Jewish community.

The baby boom of the postwar years happily resulted in many new young parents. As a matter of course, the South Bronx had its own baby equipment store, Sickser's.

Sickser's was located on the corner of Westchester and Fox, and specialized in "everything for the baby" as its slogan ran.

The inventory began with cribs, baby carriages, playpens, high chairs, changing tables, and toys. It went way beyond these to everything a baby could want or need. Mr. Sickser, assisted by his son-in-law Lou Kirshner, ran a profitable business out of the needs of the rapidly expanding child population.

The language of the store was primarily Yiddish, but Sickser's was a place where not only Jewish families but also many non-Jewish ones could acquire the necessary for their newly arrived bundles of joy. Business was particularly busy one spring day, so much so that Mr. Sickser and his son-in-law could not handle the unexpected throng of customers. Desperate for help, Mr. Sickser ran out of the store and stopped the first youth he spotted on the street. "Young man," he panted, "how would you like to make a little extra money? I need some help in the store. You want to work a little?"

The tall, lanky black boy flashed a toothy smile back. "Yes, sir, I'd like some work." "Well then, let's get started."

The boy followed his new employer into the store. Mr. Sickser was immediately impressed with the boy's good manners and demeanor.

As the days went by and he came again and again to lend his help, Mr. Sickser and Lou both became increasingly impressed with the youth's diligence, punctuality, and readiness to learn. Eventually Mr. Sickser made him a regular employee at the store. It was gratifying to find an employee with an almost soldier-like willingness to perform even the most menial of tasks, and to perform them well.

From the age of thirteen until his sophomore year in college, this young man put in from twelve to fifteen hours a week, at 50 to 75 cents an hour. Mostly, he performed general labor: assembling merchandise, unloading trucks and preparing items for shipments. He seemed, in his quiet way, to appreciate not only the steady employment but also the friendly atmosphere Mr. Sickser's store offered.

Mr. Sickser and Lou learned in time about their helper's Jamaican origins, and he in turn picked up a good deal of Yiddish.

In time the young man was able to converse fairly well with his employers, and more importantly, with a number of the Jewish customers whose English was not fluent. At the age of seventeen, the young man, while still working part-time at Sickser's, began his first semester at City College of New York. He fit in just fine with his, for the most part Jewish classmates, hardly surprising, considering that he already knew their ways and their language.

But the heavy studying in the engineering and, later, geology courses he chose proved quite challenging. The young man would later recall that Sickser's offered the one stable point in his life those days.

In 1993, in his position as the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, two years after he guided the American victory over Iraq in the Gulf War, General Colin Powell visited the Holy Land. Upon meeting Israel's Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir in Jerusalem, he greeted the Israeli with the words "Men kent reden Yiddish" (We can speak Yiddish).

As Shamir, stunned, tried to pull himself together, the current Secretary Of State continued chatting in his second-favorite language. Colin Powell never forgot his early days working at Sickser's.

## Estate Planning Provisions of 2010 Tax Act

In December of 2010 Congress passed, and President Obama signed, the most sweeping changes in the estate and gift tax laws of the past 30 years. Here is a rundown of the new provisions:

1. The estate, gift and generation skipping transfer tax exemptions have been raised to \$5,000,000 per person. What this means is that very few estates will now be subjected to federal estate taxes. An individual would have to die with a net estate (assets minus liabilities) in excess of that amount before a federal estate tax would be triggered. In addition, gifts of up to \$5,000,000 can be made during lifetime before a gift tax would be imposed and gifts or bequests to grandchildren and great-grandchildren in excess of \$5,000,000 would have to be made before a generation skipping transfer tax would be imposed.
2. The law contains a "portability" provision, which allows a married couple to utilize a combined federal estate tax exemption of \$10,000,000. Previously, both the husband and the wife had to leave assets equal to the estate tax exemption to children or anyone except each other to get the full benefit of the exemption. (Transfers between spouses are not taxed.) If, for instance, a husband died leaving all of his assets to his wife, there was no federal estate tax at his death, but his wife would have only had her own exemption to utilize at the time of her death. The husband's exemption was lost forever. Now, to the extent that one of the spouses does not fully utilize his or her exemption, it will "carry over" to the survivor. So, if a couple has combined assets of up to \$10,000,000 and one uses part or none of their exemption upon the first death, the survivor will get the benefit of the remaining unutilized exemption, up to \$10,000,000.
3. There is a provision for cost of living adjustments, which will allow the estate tax exemption to keep up with inflation. If the cost of living rises, the exemption will automatically rise, so that the question of what the appropriate federal estate tax exemption should be will not have to be constantly revisited, as has been the case in the past.
4. The estate tax rate on estates that are subject to tax has been reduced from 45% to 35%.

There are several additional caveats: First, the provisions of the 2010 Tax Act, including the provisions set forth above, are all set to expire in two years, at the end of 2012. If not extended beyond that date, the federal estate, gift and generation skipping transfer tax exemptions will revert back to \$1,000,000 per person and the maximum marginal tax rate will revert back to 55%. Second, many states, including New York, have retained their own estate taxes. New York has an estate tax exemption of only \$1,000,000 per person with a tax rate of approximately 10% for bequests in excess of that amount to anyone except for a surviving spouse.

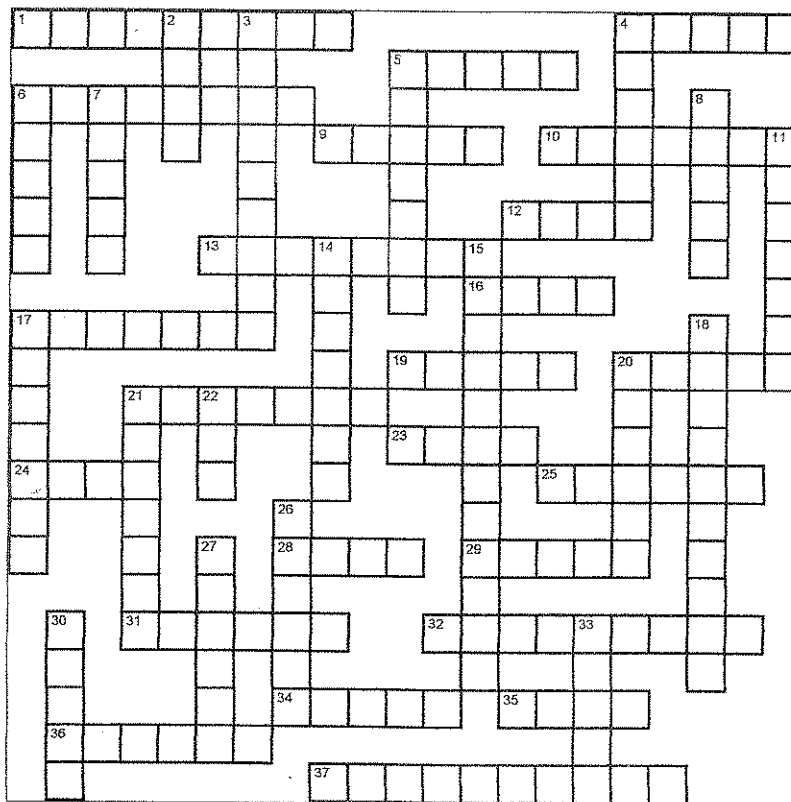
